Midnight to 4 a.m. [0000-0400]

- the mid-watch
- 4 to 8 a.m. [0400-0800]
- morning watch

8a.m. to noon [0800-1200]

- forenoon watch

Noon to 4 p.m. [1200-1600]

- afternoon watch
- 4 to 6 p.m. [1600-1800]
- first dog watch
- 6 to 8 p.m. [1800-2000]
- second dog watch
- 8 p.m. to midnight [2000-2400]
- evening watch

Each watch is four hours in length. One bell is struck after the first half-hour has passed, two bells after one hour has passed, three bells after an hour and a half, four bells after two hours, and so forth up to eight bells are struck at the completion of the four hours. Completing a watch with no incidents to report was:

"Eight bells and all is well."
